

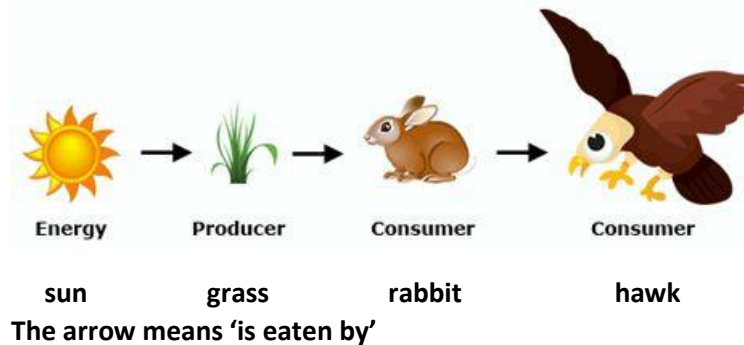
Key Vocabulary:	
Living	Can breathe and respire (feed itself), get rid of waste, move, reproduce (have babies/disperse seeds), grow.
Dead	Is no longer alive.
Never been alive	Was never able to breathe, get rid of waste, move, reproduce or grow, for example, a car or a ball.
Habitat	The home of an animal or plant.
Micro habitat	A small home for animals or plants, for example, a specific pond or tree.
Food chain	Shows the order that living things depend on each other for food.
Producer	Takes energy from the sun and grows, making its own food (usually a plant).
Primary Consumer	An organism/animal that feeds off of a producer and will usually be a herbivore.
Secondary Consumer	Eats the primary consumer and will either be a carnivore or an omnivore.
Tertiary Consumer	Eats the secondary consumer and will usually be a carnivore.
